

Message from Pastor Steve.....

Like many of you, I love this time of year; the sunshine, warming temperatures, singing birds, flowering trees, and of course those dense chartreuse colored clouds of pollen bring such joy to my heart. (Well ok, maybe not the pollen.) One of my favorite pastimes is simply being outside, walking around, absorbing beauty and examining my surroundings. We have so much to learn from God's Creation, and there is hardly a more enjoyable season to soak it all in.

Though I wouldn't hold it up to the same level as the study of Scripture, paying attention to the natural world around us can be a deeply spiritual exercise. I am reminded of Solomon. You remember Solomon the Wise. God said about Solomon that there has never been and never will be anyone as wise as he. But how did God make Solomon so very wise? It seems that Solomon too was an eager and careful student of Creation:

He would speak of trees, from the cedar that is in the Lebanon to the hyssop that grows in the wall; he would speak of animals, and birds, and reptiles, and fish. People came from all the nations to hear the wisdom of Solomon; they came from all the kings of the earth who had heard of his wisdom. -1 Kings 4:32-34

People came from all over the world to hear this man talk about trees! Can you believe that? Solomon was most certainly a visionary builder, a prolific poet, and a musician, but it seems that his world-famous wisdom blossomed mostly from his attentiveness to God's activity in all created things.

So for those of you who would also seek to be wise like Solomon, I offer this advice: go outside. Enjoy God's Creation. With physical and spiritual eyes both opened wide, look all around for signs of God's active love in the natural world.

Find evidence of resurrection in each swelling bud. See God's care for the even the littlest things as a mother robin nestles protectively over her young. This is the day that the Lord has made. Step outside and be glad in it! Yours in Christ.



CROSS CRAFT

Make this special cross as a reminder of Jesus' death and resurrection.




What you need:

- Adult help
- Piece of wood
- 5 nails
- Hammer
- 2 balls of yarn (blue and yellow)

What you do:

- 1. Hammer the nails into the wood to form a cross shape (see example).
- 2. Tie the blue yarn to the bottom nail. Wrap it up and around the top nail and back down to the bottom nail. Then wrap it around the middle nail and around the side nails. Repeat until the yarn is wrapped about halfway up the exposed nails.
- 3. Repeat step two with the yellow yarn. Wrap it around the nails until only the heads are visible.
