

A brother & sister in Christ, graciously offered their condo at the beach for Jean and I to get away for a few days! As we unpacking and settling in, I noticed a devotional book on the nightstand...titled, "Devotions for the Beach...and days you wish you were there" by Miriam Drennan.

It is an interesting devotional because it connects its readers with the common place things found at the beach (and sometimes even in Farmville)--like driftwood, flip-flops, dolphins, buoys, jellyfish, hammocks, clear nights, etc., with of course God, biblical stories, life's challenges, blessings, etc. As you might expect, many caught my attention. However one really stood out for me... and hopefully for you as well! We love to hear beach stories handed down from generation to generation, and tales that make our hearts race and stir our imagination! So Ms. Drennan asks, "How real is God to you?"...or is God more like folklore? It is a question that should stir our imagination and make our hearts race as well, as we think of Jesus being raised from the dead...being alive...and living in us—even as we read this article! Yet brothers and sisters in Christ...does it stir you? So again, how real is God to you...right now this moment?

I hope as you read those words, especially of Jesus being raised from the dead...being alive...and living in us, you maybe had goosebumps...felt the Spirit of God move within you...or SOMETHING! Otherwise, God just may be---becoming like folkore...wherein it may be nice to have a God who listens and answers our needs when we want...but in the end—Jesus is just a nice guy...and the stories in the Bible are simply nice to hear!

It is these type of battles, as Christians, we face (and are going to be discussing in a sermon series for the next several weeks). The Apostle Paul reminds us that our struggles are not with flesh and blood...but against evil, the dark spiritual forces which surround us and strives to confuse and separate us in our relationship with God, through His Son Jesus!

Brothers and sisters...God the Father, Jesus Christ/God the Son and God the Holy Spirit may be a mystery in some ways to us...but they **ARE NOT** folklore or myth! As some point in our life, you and I have proclaimed Jesus resurrected and alive...so even in the midst of confusion or wondering, we need to continue to trust in God and stand up for Jesus! What an awesome God we serve, that even in our confusion...God still loves and accepts us right where we are! Amen?

May God's grace and peace be with you...as we journey together in the mysteries of God!
